Welcome to Musée de Picardie!

Renovated, extended, open to the city and accessible to all, the museum offers an artistic journey through Prehistory, Antiquity and the Middle Ages up to the present day. Throughout this journey set among sumptuous 19th-century decor, our masterpieces await.

🚸 A model museum

Built from 1855 to 1867, Musée de Picardie is the first building to have been built specifically to house a museum. The monument is both a museum and a ceremonial place. First called the "Napoleon Museum", it became the "Picardy Museum" under the Third Republic. It exhibits artistic treasures from the Picardy region, as well as masterpieces from the history of European art. Expanded and modernised following a major renovation carried out from 2016 to 2019, the museum is now accessible, inviting and friendly.



Archaeology | 600,000 BC to the 4th century AD

A journey back to the heart of the most ancient times: in Picardy from the Palaeolithic to Roman Gaul, around the Mediterranean with Egypt, Greece and Rome.




Visit Musée de Picardie
